



Colorado wins regular season, beat Tulsa 4-0
Renegades, Arrows will square-off in semi-finals

And when all the smoke cleared the Colorado Comets stood nearly as tall as the Rockies above them, or so it seemed to Ed Eid and his first season team, as they avenged their only regular season loss by turning back the Tulsa Renegades, 4-0, to claim the regular season and the championship game's host role that goes with the first place finish.

A hat trick by Mark Perdew put an end to the Renegades quest, who no face the Addison Arrows this weekend in Tulsa in a best of three semi-finals series. The winner goes to Colorado Springs for the August 12 final, which will be held in conjunction with the USSF's convention.

Tulsa will host the Arrows on Friday, August 4 at 7:30 and Saturday, August 5 at 7:30 at Tulsa's Metro Christian Academy. A third game, if necessary, will be played Sunday at 5 PM. All games must come to a decision, and the series winner must win two games, regardless of scores. The two teams split 2-1 games during the regular season.

In other season ending games the Austin Sockadillos ramped over the Oklahoma City Warriors 7-2, to finish fourth, while Albuquerque Gunners ended fifth with a 4-2 win at Lubbock; San Antonio Heat beat Oklahoma City Warriors on Saturday 2-1, dooming the Warriors to the cellar spot...Commissioner Francisco Marcos also announced that the Tucson Amigos are the SISL's latest franchise and that he hopes to name three additional teams before the league's AGM in Colorado Springs on August 11-13.

Tucson getting semi-pro indoor soccer team

South Tucson will be the home of a semi-professional indoor soccer league team and indoor soccer facility, according to plans announced yesterday by the organizers.

The Tucson Amigos officially became the 13th team in the Southwest Indoor Soccer League, which is expected to expand to 14 teams with a franchise in Phoenix before the upcoming season, said the Amigos' president, Dennis Archer.

The announcement was made at the future home of the Amigos, a 14,000-square-foot warehouse at East 36th Street and South 4th Avenue that is being converted into an indoor soccer facility.

Archer said the facility will include a

standard indoor soccer field with bleacher seating for 400-500 spectators, offices and locker rooms.

Southwest Indoor Soccer League president Francisco Marcos said the league will begin its fourth season in November and run through March with teams playing 24-game schedules.

Archer is a Tucson businessman who organized the effort with Sabino High School boys soccer coach Ron Fox and Santa Rita girls coach Rob Ratzen. Archer said the intent is to generate more interest in the sport and additional training for youths in the Tucson area.

Archer coached a junior team that qualified for the National Junior Indoor Soccer Championships last May.

The semi-pro Amigos will be made up of

players from the Tucson area, and junior teams will be formed to play in the facility, Fox said.

"The whole idea of the center is to develop quality players," he said. "All the players will be from Tucson. We've got a vast array of talent here."

Fox will coach the Amigos, who are scheduled to open their season Nov. 17.

Marcos said they will play in a division that will include teams from Phoenix, El Paso and Albuquerque. The league has franchises in Texas, Kansas and Oklahoma.

It is a non-profit league consisting of amateur players from the areas where the teams are located, Marcos said.

"We believe in developing the best local talent available," Marcos said. "That's what this league is about."

Marcos said league rules require that 10 of the 20 players on a team's roster be U.S. citizens, three have to be under 19 years old and no more than three can be more than 30 years old.

Funding for the teams comes from sponsors who provide various services necessary for the league to operate, Archer said.

For instance, a local construction company is building the soccer arena. Teams are required to make arrangements for lodging for visiting teams and usually have that donated by a hotel or motel in the area, Marcos said.

None of the players will earn salaries.

The center is expected to officially open with a youth tournament Aug. 14-27. An adult tournament will be held Aug. 21-26, Archer said.
